Middleton-on-Sea Parish Flood Watch Scheme



MIDDLETON-ON-SEA PARISH Flood Watch

The Parish Council have approved the setting up of the Middleton-on-Sea Parish Flood Watch Scheme

The scope of flood watch will extend to surface water, sewage and groundwater, surface water flooding and shall include properties, roads and fields

The purpose of flood watch will be to establish a coordinated basis for dealing with flooding issues, including communication with West Sussex County Council, Arun District Council and the Environment Agency. To provide an evidence base for Neighbourhood Development Plan policies, to maximise awareness to prompt community action and to provide a basis for objecting to inappropriate development.

The setting up of Flood Watch Coordinators whose role will extend to setting up a team of Flood Watch Wardens (around 12 people) across the parish. Instructing Wardens on how to complete a Flood Watch Report and the publicising of Flood Watch via posters on parish council notice boards and on parish Council website.

A Flood Report mechanism will be made available for parishioners to report incidents of flooding, the majority of these reports will be generated by the Flood Watch Wardens. Completed forms to be sent to the Parish Clerk.

NEIGHBOURHOOD DEVELOPMENT PLAN (NDP) UPDATE

APPOINTMENT OF CONSULTANT – The Neighbourhood Development Plan Coordination Group have appointed Alison Eardley to assist it in preparing the NDP. Alison has run her own consultancy since 2011 and regularly works supporting Town and Parish Councils and community groups on planning projects, particularly neighbourhood plans. She has worked on over 80 neighbourhood plans across the country with upward of 50 of these having passed the referendum stage and now made plans. A neighbourhood plan drafted by Alison for a parish council was awarded the Excellence in Planning Award by the Royal Town Planning Institute.

PUBLIC MEETING – A meeting to discuss the NDP has been held on the 18th March 2023 in the main Hall of the Jubilee Hall on Saturday 18th March 2023. At the time of writing this review and to meet print deadlines the outcome of this first meeting with parishioners to provide the reasons for preparing a NDP will be provided through the parish council website and in the next edition of Middleton News. A flyer was delivered to 3,000 houses in the parish during the first week of March 2023 to advise people of the meeting and to meet representatives of the NDP Coordination Group at the meeting who would answer any questions.

QUESTIONNAIRE/SURVEY – By the time you read this edition of Middleton News 3,000 questionnaires will have been delivered to houses in the parish. This is an important document and provides you the opportunity to express your views and influence the future development of our Parish. We are inviting everyone aged 18 and over to express their opinions on a range of issues by replying to the Questionnaire. Evidence from the questionnaire will be used to help develop the NDP.

There are two ways to complete the questionnaire, online or by completing the paper copy, if you complete the paper copy then the questionnaire will advise you where you can return your completed questionnaire, it will also advise where additional copies can be obtained.

New Benches Shrubbs Field – Two new recycled benches have been installed and a program to change out the wooden benches and picnic tables over the next two years is planned. The new benches require no maintenance and are set to last 25 years so expenditure on repairing the wooden benches and picnic tables will be reduced over time.

We will also be looking at the benches in the parish as these are also made of wood and again these will be changed out to recycle benches over the 12-24 months.

DISTRICT & PARISH COUNCIL ELECTIONS – Elections take place on the 4th May 2023. The deadline for delivery of Nomination Papers to the Returning Officer at Arun DistrictCouncilisbefore4.00pmonTuesday 4th April 2023. Arun District Council will provide Publication of Statement of Persons Nominated. The Parish Council are allowed 12 Parish Councillors if the number of Persons Nominated is 12 or below then it is an uncontested election and all those nominated will become Parish Councillors. If over 12 persons are nominated then a Parish Election will take place on Thursday 4th May 2023 with the count and verification of Parish Councillors on Friday 5th May 2023. If there is an election then voters will need to show photo ID.



FRIENDS OF MIDDLETON-ON-SEA POND AND GREEN (CHARITY NO: 1170594)

Well, here we are again with the start of another year at the Pond and Green.

After a relatively mild Winter with one or two cold snaps, we have had a colourful Spring of snowdrops, crocus and daffodils to be followed by bluebells and other early Summer flowering plants. We will continue to increase planting bulbs and other plants year on year whilst trying to introduce and maintain English native plants where possible.

We have been very lucky to be able to replace one of our old wooden seats at the southern end with another seat made from recycled plastic bottles. This has been donated by the ladies from Middleton on Sea Women's Institute, showing a real commitment to our Charity and the community, for which we are all very grateful.

We have removed the wire cage from our floating island, and along with the two duckhouses, it seems to be providing, competition amongst the mallards and moorhens for nesting sites. Let us hope for the splash of tiny ducklings in the near future. The Pond is now approximately 3 metres at its deepest point.

The usual frog migration took place again in late February, and frogspawn was in abundance. Statistically only 5 in every 1000 eggs survive to adulthood, but now the Pond does not dry out we are giving the frog, toad and newt population the best possible chance.

I reported last year that persons unknown had "donated" fish to the Pond, and whilst there are two trains of thought as to whether this is a good thing or not, they are very noticeable especially on bright days as the sun picks up their colour as they swim in small shoals around the Pond, existing happily with both the permanent and visiting ducks. We would ask you however not to put more fish in the Pond so that the newt, frog and toad population can flourish.

We had to spend approximately £1000 safeguarding the large horse chestnut tree on the Sea Lane/Middleton Road boundary following an aerial survey. This has reduced its canopy by a couple of metres in the hope that we can extend its life further, given the significant rot in the main trunk.

We hope to hold our usual May Saturday morning fund raising event and hope you will support us as you have done in the past. As we always emphasise, we are the Trustees of YOUR Pond and Green.

Warm Room & Community Café Facility

WARM ROOM & COMMUNITY CAFÉ FACILITY



The Warm Room facility closed at the end of February 2023 which was the intended close down day advised to the local community.

Unfortunately attendance was low and although regulars were starting to come along the overall numbers were not good.

There are a number of reasons that we could give such as lack of signage and information to the community at the beginning, bad weather when it was icy and wet, Shrubbs Field was waterlogged and the Sports Pavilion was difficult to get to but at the end of the day it would appear that the community did not want a Warm Room facility.

The volunteers who put their names down to attend the facility in the hope that attendances would improve need to be congratulated and thanked for their commitment to the cause. It must have been very frustrating for them to have to sit around waiting for someone to turn up but nobody does.

The parish has a good record of getting volunteers together when needed in the parish for example during COVID when people needed shopping and prescriptions and again now when volunteers have put their names forward to assist those that need to have a place to go for a cuppa and a chat.

So a big thank you to all the volunteers for all their great work in running the Warm Room facility. There has been some talk about having a Community Café during the spring and summer months but this will need volunteers to run it although the Parish Council will assist with funding.

The Community Café project need volunteers to go forward and for a plan to be drafted as to what the Community Café project could look like but at the end of the day we are asking a big commitment from local volunteers if this project is to get off the ground.
